

Maria Halamska is a professor of humanities and rural sociologist. She occupies the office of the Head of the Department of Rural Sociology at the Institute of Rural and Agricultural Development of the Polish Academy of Sciences.

From 1997 to 2018, she was a professor at the Center for European Regional and Local Studies at the University of Warsaw, in 1994 a visiting professor at Universite Paris X - Nanterre, and from 2002 to 2003 a visiting professor at Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales in Paris. She managed over a dozen scientific projects and is a co-author of several international projects, including: research on the functioning of family farms in various socio-economic systems, the decollectivization of agriculture in Central Europe, the mutation of agrarian models in Europe (Copernicus program), territorial development in Central Europe (ALDETEC no. ANR-08-BLAN-0270-01). In recent years, she has been conducting research on changes in the social structure of the Polish countryside. She is an author of over 200 scientific papers, including several monographs.

Moreover, Professor Halamska has been a member of the Academie d'Agriculture de France since 2007.
