

A PROCEDURE SECURING AUTHENTICITY OF PUBLICATIONS
(PREVENTION OF GHOSTWRITING)

In line with the standards for scientific journals, set by the Ministry of Science and Higher Education, the editorial staff of the “Problems of Agricultural Economy” requests the Authors to provide information on entities contributing to the preparation of a publication (substantive, physical, financial contributions, etc.). The Authors of papers should clearly and reliably present results of their works, whether or not they are direct authors, or whether or not they used help of a specialised entity (natural or legal person).

“Ghostwriting” – is a situation when someone contributed to the preparation of a publication, but the person was not credited as one of the authors or the role of such a person was not mentioned in the acknowledgments to the publication.

“Guest authorship” – is a situation when the contribution of the author is slight or none at all, but he/she is credited as the author/co-author of the publication.

To prevent such unwanted practices the editorial staff of the “Problems of Agricultural Economics” applies the following rules:

1. Authors of publications should inform about the contribution of individual persons in the preparation of the publication (giving affiliations and stating contributions, i.e. information about who is the author of the concept, assumptions, methods, protocol, etc., used in preparing the publication), keeping in mind that the person submitting the paper is primarily responsible for provision of the data.
2. If **“ghostwriting”** and **“guest authorship”** are identified the editorial staff documents such cases and informs on the fact the institution employing the Author and associations, teams and scientific communities where he/she is a member.
3. If the research used in the publication was co-financed, the Author has to inform about the source of funding.
